Your Donations at Work

BackPack Attack

Club members donated school supplies for underprivileged students in the Indianapolis Public School system by partnering with IUPUI and the BackPack Attack Community Engagement Program during the fall of 2011.

Butler University

The Foundation has provided support to Butler for programs including special lectures and student scholarships. In recent years, funding has come from the Lawrence E. and Maysel D. East Scholarship, which is awarded each year to a superior student who demonstrates good citizenship, academic excellence and financial need. The Foundation began supporting Butler in 1965, directing funds to scholarships in 1974.

Charity Dye Center for Inquiry III (IPS School #27)

On May 18, 2011, over a dozen members spent an afternoon helping to do the preparatory work to build a new school playground at the new Charity Dye Center for Inquiry III, located at 545 E. 19th Street. Our Club has had a longstanding involvement with IPS School #27, and we were excited to be called upon to help build a new playground so that school children and those living in the neighborhood near Dr. Martin Luther King Jr. Park can enjoy countless hours of recreation for years to come. It was very rewarding to see a new park be built from the ground up, especially as IPS was in the midst of completely revamping the building and grounds, as well as their faculty/staff and educational approach. During the fall of 2011 new member Eric Steel

worked with fellow Kiwanis Club of Indianapolis members to re-establish a Kiwanis K-Kids Club at the school, with the support of Principal Jamilyn Bertsch and faculty representatives Kristopher Landmeier and Karla Reilly.

Gennesaret Free Clinic

Through the generosity and caring spirit of our members, we regularly collect toiletries and personal health and beauty aids for distribution by this agency that offers a wide array of quality health services for the homeless and working poor of Indianapolis.

Indianapolis Downtown, Inc. & Indianapolis Parks & Recreation

On October 15, 2011, over a dozen members of our Club and participants from our Aktion Club for "handi-capable" adults and our eight school-based sponsored clubs joined in planting over 80 trees in Martin Park off 16th Street several blocks west of the IU Health/Methodist Hospital campus. We were aided by the nurturing oversight of IDI's Anne Maschmeyer. Our Kultivation Committee, headed by Roger Kanne, plans these tree plantings and city beautification service projects on a regular basis, and our members enjoy the opportunity of interfacing with the youth we support through our sponsored club programs that range from elementary school to two middle schools and two high schools, through three local universities.

Mary Riggs Neighborhood Center

On December 10, 2011, a half-dozen members from our Fostering Families Committee conducted their annual "Mentoring Philanthropy" service project on behalf of the

Mary Riggs Neighborhood Center. This United Way agency provides critical services and supports for individuals and families in southwest Indianapolis. With a set budget within our Foundation funding, we took a half-dozen children shopping to select holiday gifts for two needy families from their neighborhood. Members helped the kids make wise purchasing choices, providing them with the opportunity to "pay it forward" and help other struggling families have a joyous holiday.

Phones for Troops

Throughout the year we collect gently used, but discarded, mobile phones and then donate them to support our American troops, courtesy of Liberty Tax Service's distribution efforts. We also contributed used cell phones to a local domestic violence shelter.

Riley Hospital for Children

On August 12, 2011, over a dozen members volunteered to stage a Kiwanis Carnival for Riley Kids. They manned various game and activity booths in the entry pavilion of Riley Hospital for Children, so the kids and caregivers could take a well-deserved break and have some fun! This second-annual service project augments our commitment to fund two Kiwanis Magic Castle Carts and the goodies distributed from them by our tireless volunteers, all in an effort to brighten the lives of Riley kids and caregivers who endure so much stress as they seek healthier futures. On September 16, 2011, nearly 100 members and guests attended our 95th Anniversary Gala & Bids for Kids Auction; during this fundraising event we celebrated the life of six-year-old Riley patient, Braden Tamosaitis

(beloved son of Becky & Kevin) by awarding him an adaptive bicycle to help him regain strength and enjoy being a kid again! As a result of his excitement, attendees contributed \$5,010 during our "Bids from the Heart" auction segment, which will allow our Foundation to purchase future adaptive bikes for deserving Riley Kids!

Ronald McDonald House

Our members collect pop tabs from soft drink cans throughout the year. These are then donated as part of our ongoing "Pick Up the Tab for the Ronald McDonald House" campaign to support this shelter for caregivers of our beloved Riley Kids.

The Salvation Army

On December 16, 2011, while Governor Daniels launched his legislative agenda as part of our weekly meeting, over 50 of our members participated in The Salvation Army's annual campaign to brighten the holidays for needy and vulnerable families in our community. They donated time to ring the red kettle bells at four posts in and around Circle Centre Mall, collecting over \$11,229 in donations.

Southport High School

On March 15, 2011, a half-dozen of our members attended the annual Kiwanis Improvement Program for Southport High School "KIPS" Program luncheon. This scholarship and recognition program, and the celebratory luncheon, is funded by our Foundation with financial assistance from longstanding member Thomas Dunham and auto dealer Ray Skillman. For the past two years most of the administrative work has been conducted by members of the Kiwanis Club of Perry Township, in conjunction with Principal Barbara Brower and Assistant Principal Amy Boone. Our Club originated this program after reaching out to all Marion County high schools 24 year ago; it is designed to motivate and reward each student who has an improved grade point average and excellent attendance for the school year. Four seniors

who have demonstrated grade improvement and excellent attendance over several years receive \$1,000 scholarships from our Foundation, and a fifth student is selected to receive the coveted \$5,000 Dunham Scholarship.

Starfish Initiative

Several of our members have volunteered to help the Starfish Initiative as they bring together disadvantaged teens from all area high schools in search of community service leadership training. This program complements our seven other youth sponsored clubs in IPS schools and Perry Meridian High School, as well as Butler University, IUPUI and the University of Indianapolis.

University of Indianapolis

The University of Indianapolis receives scholarship funds through the Lawrence E. and Maysel D. East Scholarship for a needy resident of Marion or surrounding counties. The scholarship recognizes a student excelling in academics, citizenship and leadership. Kiwanis has contributed these scholarship funds for 36 years.

Kiwanis Committees Receive Support From the Foundation

Community Service Committees

Fostering Families

Fostering Families works with organizations in the community to focus on the need for foster homes that care for children ages birth to 18. The committee has held a Faith, Hope and Love luncheon to recognize outstanding foster parents at a club meeting in May for the past 22 years. The club also contributed to the Mary Riggs Center Fostering Independence Program which assists emancipated foster children to integrate into the community. The second annual Kiwanis Kids Triathlon was held in June with proceeds designated to help support Fostering Families programs.

Kiwanis Kultivation

For 13 years, under the leadership of Indianapolis Downtown Inc., our Kiwanis Club has participated in community tree plantings to beautify the city of Indianapolis. This year we had participation from Builders Club, Key Club, Circle K & Aktion Club members.

Youth Service Committees

Young Children: Priority One

Selects, plans, implements and supports projects that have a relationship to the major emphasis for the year, as determined by Kiwanis International and the Indiana District. For many years, the major emphasis has been on young children. Programs include volunteering with Charity Dye School preschoolers, providing funds to purchase educational materials for Charity Dye pre-school and kindergarten classes and purchasing educational magazines for IPS pre-school children.

Kiwanis Partners with Riley Project

Since 1998, Downtown Kiwanians have worked to ensure the Magic Castle Carts developed by our club are in working order, supply the carts with activities for hospitalized children and provide volunteers to wheel the carts to the rooms of young Riley Hospital patients. The volunteers, through activities contained in the carts, bring a time of happiness (smile therapy) to the children, families, and staff of Riley Hospital.

Partners in Education

This committee works directly with the staff and students at Harshman Magnet Middle School #101 to provide programs to better attendance and academic performance. Funded this year were: Accelerated Readers, Young Hoosier Book Awards, RIF, Guest Readers, Attendance Incentives, Dad's Breakfast, Career Day, and a party for students who showed improvement in grades, attitude and attendance.

Youth Recognition Lunches

Abe Lincoln Recognition Awards

Recognizes school nominees and awards four scholarships at a luncheon for high school seniors who have overcome severe obstacles in their lives. Each nominee is interviewed and invited to bring family and school personnel to the February luncheon when their accomplishments are highlighted. This signature program has been conducted for 36 years, and over \$40,000 in scholarship assistance was provided by our Foundation.

Boys Basketball Finals Luncheon

Recognizes the scholastic and athletic achievements of Marion County high school basketball teams in March. The luncheon features the eight state finals coaches and teams. Five scholarships are given to the outstanding senior scholar/athletes from Marion County. A grant from the Indiana Pacers funded the five academic All-Star scholarships in 2011. This program has been conducted for 65 years.

Football Awards Luncheon

Recognizes the scholastic and athletic achievements of Marion County high school football teams. A scholarship is given to the outstanding football senior scholar/athlete. Athletic directors, coaches, cheerleaders, band directors and drum majors, and Key Club presidents and sponsors are also recognized. A grant from the Indianapolis Colts helped fund the 2011 event. This program has been conducted for 55 years.

Kiwanis Improvement Program at Southport High School (KIPS)
KIPS conducts a program at Southport High School to motivate and reward students who have an improved grade-point average, recognizing the four most improved students in the freshman, sophomore and junior classes. Scholarships are awarded to five outstanding seniors.

Kiwanis Service Leadership Programs

K-Kids Club
Sponsors, promotes and advises a school and community service club for elementary school children. In the fall of 2011 we began sponsoring a new K-Kids Club at Charity Dye Center for Inquiry III.



The K-Kids Club at Charity Dye Center for Inquiry collected \$200 by selling candy bars and purchased diapers and formula for Dayspring Center residents.

Builders Club
Sponsors, promotes and advises a school and community service club for middle school youth. In the fall of 2008 we began sponsoring a new Builders Club at Francis W. Parker School #57.

Key Club
Sponsors, promotes and advises a service club for high school students that is patterned after a traditional Kiwanis Club. In 2011 we sponsored clubs at Perry Meridian High School and at the Starfish Initiative.

Circle K
Sponsors, promotes and advises a service club for college students patterned after a traditional Kiwanis Club. We sponsored three clubs; one at Butler University, one at IUPUI, and one at the University of Indianapolis.

Aktion Club
Sponsors, promotes and advises a service club patterned after a traditional Kiwanis Club for adults with disabilities. We sponsor one club, which meets every month at Goodwill Industries.

Other Kiwanis Contributions

Indiana District Foundation
We give annually to the Kiwanis Indiana District Foundation to help fund scholarships for high school students planning to attend a college or university within the state of Indiana.

Indiana District Outreach
The Outreach program helps defray costs for young people in Circle K and Key Clubs when they attend board meetings, conferences or conventions.

Kiwanis International Foundation
We give annually to the Kiwanis International Foundation to help fund worldwide projects, clubs, club foundations, or district foundations.

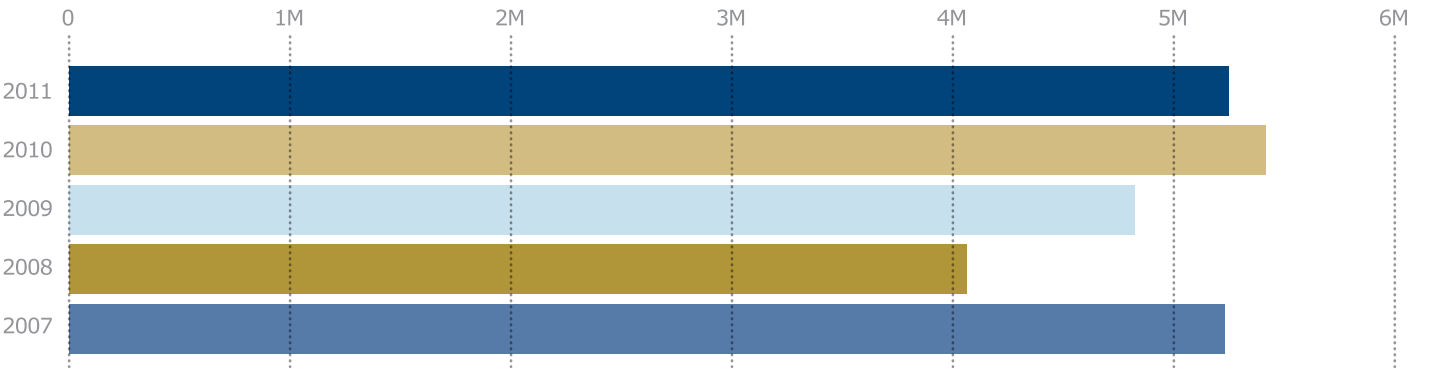

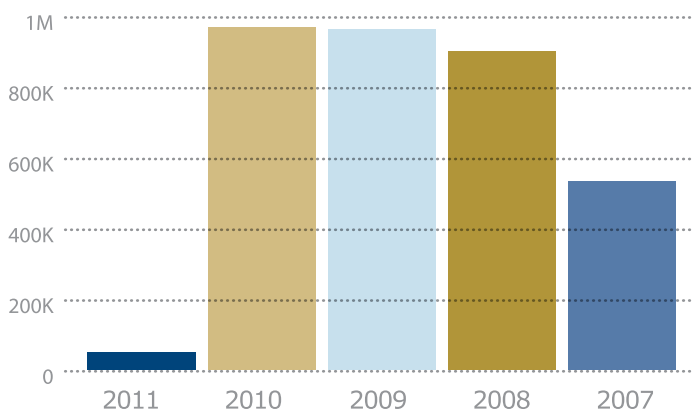

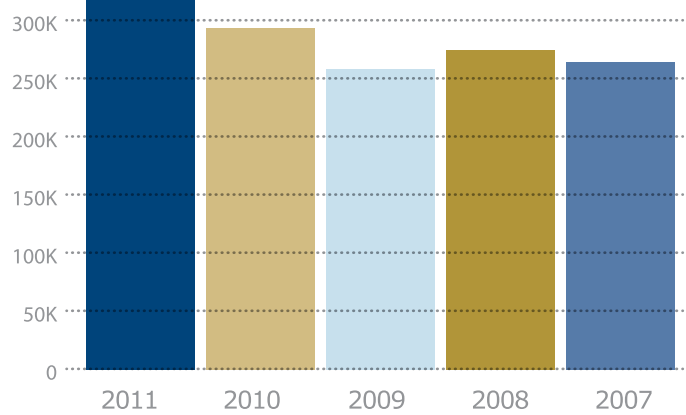
Total Net Assets



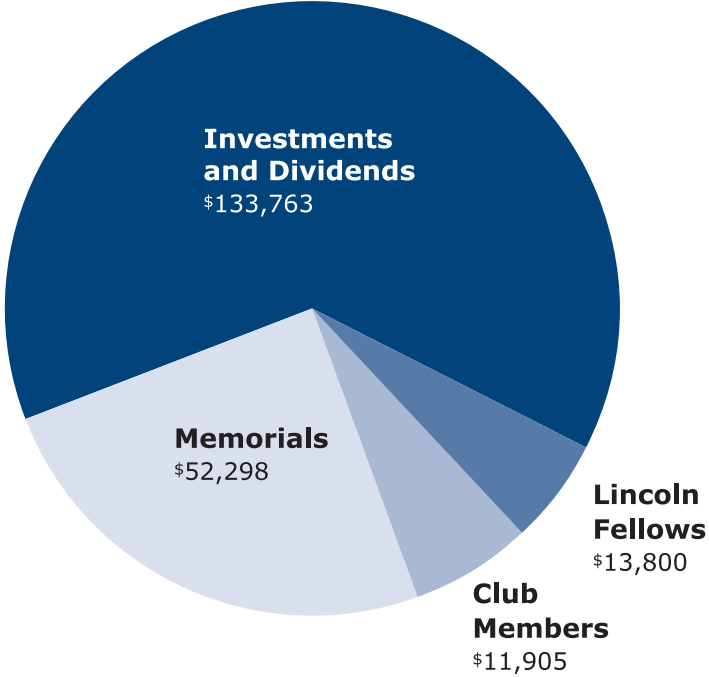
Total Revenue



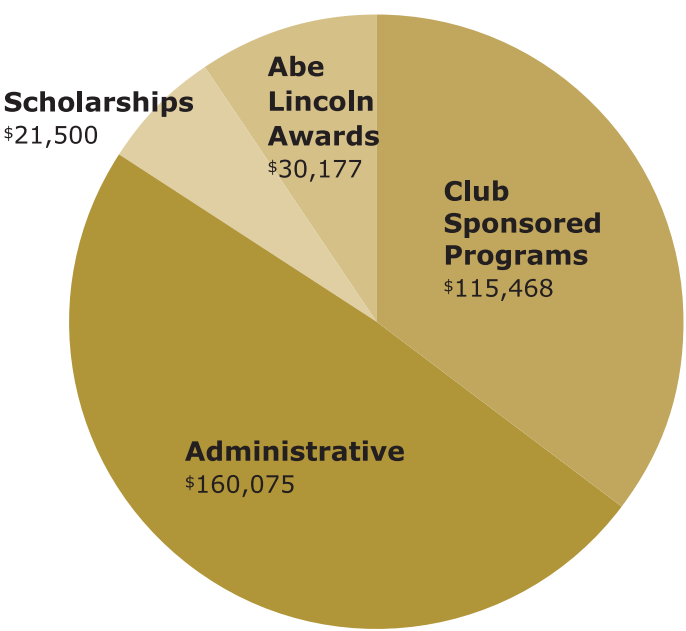
Total Disbursements
